Dear Friends,

November marks the beginning of the holiday season. For us, it is also a season of worship and thanksgiving. I pray that we'll all be able to remember "the reason for the season," and that it will be for us a time of blessing, reflection and new life.

Our services reflect the change: on November 7th we'll celebrate All Saints Day, especially remembering family and friends who are in the larger "communion of saints." Then on November 14th, we celebrate our patron saint, Martin. The legend of St. Martin is that he cut his cloak in half to share with a poor beggar, and that night he had a dream in which the beggar in his cloak was actually Christ. In honor of that legacy, we will be collecting coats to give to others in need. And in honor of our commitment to caring community, we will have a party! At 5:00 p.m. we'll gather for a pot luck supper and game night. (Look for details later).

On the morning of the 14th, we'll have our pledge in-gathering. Bob Williams and his committee have been praying and giving hours of their time and energy, with the strong support of the Vestry, because they know how important it is for the mission of our church that we be financially solvent. Please bring your pledge cards that day, so that together we can offer them to the Lord for his work in our parish and so that we can pray together for God's blessing and strength and guidance for the coming year.

On the 21st will be a healing service marking the end of the Pentecost season and looking ahead to Advent. We will have a Thanksgiving eve service on the 24th at 7:00 p.m. There will be opportunities

for outreach this year with our coat drive and Thanksgiving baskets.

But we also want to be sure that all of our own parish who want to can be with a family and/or friends for Thanksgiving dinner. Don't be surprised if you get an invitation to dinner! (Please do let me know if you'd like to be part of this shared holiday.)

Then Advent begins on November 28th. (And we won't think about December yet!)

How does our theme of "Embracing the Kingdom" fit with all this? It's part of seeing what God is doing here at St. Martin's and also seeing what God is doing in our personal lives as we respond to the life he has called us to live. I believe each of us is here at this time and in this place because God has a purpose for us. Together we have an opportunity to be part of God's work in the world. So, "embracing the kingdom" is opening our hearts wide to the Holy Spirit and watching the power of God at work. Wow! (Did you know that Allelu-jah can be translated "Wow, God!") Thank God, this is an Allelu-jah season!

Vestry Meeting Highlights
Tuesday, October 5, 2004

Members in attendance: Kathy Christy, Alan Engels, Missi Kern, Cynthia Obermeyer, Jane Owens, Bruce Raymond, Georgia Reissig, Sue Richardson, Marilyn Schneider, Bryan Shallenberger. Guests: Mike Blaser and Bob Williams

Alan Engels conducted prayers for guidance and understanding from the BCP. The minutes of the September 7, 2004 meeting were affirmed as approved by all members via email. Mike presented the financial report for the period ended September 30, 2004. Actual revenue continues to lag behind the budgeted amount.

Bob Williams discussed the scheduled house meetings. It was agreed that Bob will include in his discussion his suggested 2005 planning schedule, as follows:

Parish survey regarding ministries/needs/priorities	1Q
Collate and publish survey results	2Q
Create 2006 budget based on survey results	3Q
Stewardship drive	3Q-4Q

Marilyn reminded the Vestry of the upcoming deadline commitment for its previously-agreed-upon goal regarding small group planning. The deadline for creating a plan to implement small group fellowships is the beginning of Advent. The Vestry discussed the task at length and arrived at the following conclusions:

- Ø Many small groups already exist at St. Martin's.
- Ø Groups can meet for a variety of reasons, including task, spirituality, and study.
- Ø Groups can be based on long-term, short-term, and even drop-in commitments.
- Ø To meet the Vestry goal, small groups must intentionally promote fellowship/relationships.
- Ø The initial focus of the small group effort at St. Martin's should begin with existing groups.
- Ø Leaders of existing small groups can promote fellowship efforts within the groups.
- Ø The targets for promotional efforts should be those who are not already in at least one group.
- Ø Information about existing small groups can be publicized to create interest.
- Ø The small group plan could be supplemented by a parish event (Faith Alive, parish retreat, etc.) to renew and encourage participation.

Bruce will ask Tom Keables and Landy Phillipe to review and comment on the new Diocesan policy regarding prevention of sexual abuse. Marilyn has renewed our subscription to the Parish Resource Library for 2005.

Marilyn is awaiting the scheduling of surgery sometime in January. In expectation of this event, the Parish Annual Meeting has been set for Sunday, January 9 (Epiphany Sunday) in the hope that Marilyn will be able to attend. Bruce, Missi, and Kathy will meet to nominate Vestry candidates to replace them as their terms expire. Bruce announced his intention to step aside as Senior Warden in January.

The meeting adjourned with a prayer at 9:25 PM. The next regular meeting will be Tuesday, November 2nd at 7 PM.

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS TO THE VESTRY

Nominations for the Vestry are now being received. You may nominate yourself or someone else by including name and phone number on the nomination sheet found in the Narthex. Please place nomination in nomination box by December 1st to be included on the ballot. (Nominations can be received from the floor at the annual meeting.) For the year 2004, there are three 3-year positions open.

To assist you in your prayerful consideration, the canonical requirements for vestry membership and the recommended qualities are included here.

WHO MAY SERVE?

Parish members 18 years of age or older who are communicants in good standing. A communicant in good standing is one who is a baptized member of record in the parish who is regular in worship, and who prays, works, and gives of their resources for the spread of God's kingdom.

WHAT DOES A VESTRY DO? (See Job Description "Vestry Member" next page)

The Vestry works to keep before the worshipping community its baptismal responsibility to serve those who do not yet know the love of Christ Jesus. To do this it is the responsibility of the Vestry to meet in prayer to discern the specific goals that carry out the parish mission and vision statements. The Vestry is also responsible for supporting the work of the National Episcopal Church, the Bishop and Diocese of Colorado, the Mission Area to which the parish belongs, and the staff of the parish. The Vestry is required as well to be a good steward of parish financial resources, and the buildings and grounds. It is also responsible for the search and call of a new rector when a vacancy occurs.

WHAT TIME CONSIDERATIONS ARE THERE IN SERVING?

Vestry terms are for three years. Vestry meets for a minimum of one night per month and meets more often as the life and work of the parish requires. The Vestry members commit to one or two weekends a year in retreat and long-range planning. Each vestry person is also a liaison to one of the commissions of the parish and meets with that commission chairperson or group on a regular basis. Special ministries or projects often arise that require the leadership of a vestry person.

WHEN NOMINATING SOMEONE FOR VESTRY CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING:

- Do they have a regular prayer life and believe prayer is instrumental to discerning God's will?
- Are they involved in the study of scripture and regular in worship of the community?
- Do they demonstrate the non-judgmental love of Jesus Christ in their everyday life?
- Is this person responding to the call of their baptism to be a servant of God to all God's people and is committed to ministry?
- Has this person made a commitment in the sacrament of confirmation?
- Have they demonstrated effective parish leadership in other areas of ministry?
- Do they give of their financial resources in just proportion of their income?
- Are they active in greeting newcomers and welcoming them into the life of the parish?
- Are they willing to work with other leadership to form an environment of mutual trust and ministry, working within a discernment and consensus model of decision making?
- Are they able to address conflict and take a firm stand when necessary for the well-being of the whole community?

A note to those considering a term as a Vestry member:

Please examine your schedule and your current commitments. Part of the stewardship of a Vestry member is to make sure you have the commitment, time, and energy to give fully to this ministry.

Vestry Member

General Job Description:

Vestry members are responsible for spiritual leadership and direction of all programs within the parish. Vestry members are to be faithful stewards of the church's resources, including its people. The mission of the church and the many steps to accomplish that mission are formulated, communicated and accomplished under the Vestry's oversight. The Vestry also provides for management of business and financial affairs and the care of parish property. The Vestry acts with the advice and consultation of the rector of the parish. Our vestry operates under the consensus model for decision making. A single term on the Vestry is normally three years.

Accountable To:

Vestry members are accountable to the Congregation, Wardens, and Rector.

Qualifications, Responsibilities and Duties:

The following outlines qualifications, responsibilities, and specific duties associated with a Vestry member position.

A. Qualifications

1. A baptized member in good standing who reaffirms their embrace of the Baptismal Covenant as a personal guide for living and pledges to apply its tenets to their service to the Parish on the Vestry.
2. A demonstrated strong personal commitment to Jesus Christ including regular church attendance, participation in church activities, and a dedication to prayer, study and action.
3. Strong leadership skills with the ability to communicate and cooperate with others.
4. A commitment to the tithe in time, talents, and treasure.

B. Responsibilities

1. Assume leadership as a Vestry Liaison for at least one area of ministry in the parish.
2. Act as an agent and legal representative in all matters of the parish.
3. Support the work of the National Episcopal Church, the Bishop and the Diocese of Colorado, the High Plains Region to which the parish belongs, and the parish staff.
4. Support and collaborate on the general oversight of parish life and ministry including planning and implementation of short and long term goals.
5. Assist in resolution of conflicts within the parish by encouraging and facilitating direct communication among parties.
6. Pray regularly for the Parish, Rector, and Vestry.
7. Maintain a commitment to the consensus model of decision making.

C. Duties

1. Attend regularly scheduled Vestry meetings once per month and the annual Vestry Retreat. If a meeting must be missed, notification of absence must be given to the Rector or a Warden in advance. Additionally, make every effort to be at any additionally scheduled Vestry meetings that may be required to complete Vestry business and duties.
2. Attempt to attend parish events, and if possible quarterly Parish Council meetings. Congregations need leaders who are visibly committed.
3. Present matters of parish life and ministry which need attention to the Rector, Wardens and /or Vestry, as appropriate.
4. Participate regularly in discussions and decision-making and support and interpret the decisions of the Vestry, Wardens and Rector to other parishioners.
5. Vestry members will teller in pairs on Sundays and occasionally after other special services. (With ten Vestry members, this means one will teller for two Sundays, then not again for eight Sundays.)
6. In general after parish events and in particular after performing duties as a teller, lock the building, close the parking lot gate, and set the thermostats to their proper levels.
7. As a Vestry Liaison:
 - a. Represent the interests of your ministry in all Vestry decisions.
 - b. Be an active and visible resource for the ministry leader.
 - c. Serve as a first point of contact for the ministry leader to the Vestry.
 - d. Arrange for the chairperson(s) of your ministry to meet with the Vestry once during the year at a regularly scheduled Vestry meeting to communicate with the Vestry.
 - e. Meet or talk with your ministry's chairperson(s) at least once per quarter.
 - f. Regularly communicate the desires, needs, and plans of the ministry to the Vestry.

Dear Gracie,

I know about bishops, priests and deacons, but I heard someone say there were four orders of ministry. Four? I thought there were only three.

Dear C in A,

The other person was right. We can easily name three of them: bishop, priest, and deacon. And the fourth? What would that be? Archdeacon? Dean? No - it's us. It's you and me and all of the rest of the children of God. We are called the laity or lay people. We have Lay Eucharistic Ministers (LEM's) and Lay Readers. If we stop to think about it, the greatest portion of the work of carrying out God's mission for the Church in the world is done by lay people. The word "lay" comes by way of French and English from a Greek word "laos" meaning "the people". It is the people in response to their baptismal promise who are to be the hands, the feet, and the voice of Christ in the world. We live our daily life and do whatever we can to be the church in the world. That is our ministry, and we are ordained to it by a sacrament as solemn as Holy Orders. It was that first great sacrament in which many of us participated soon after our birth - Baptism - in which we were "ordained" as members of the family of God, the laity. It was at that time that we were given our ministry.

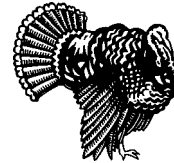

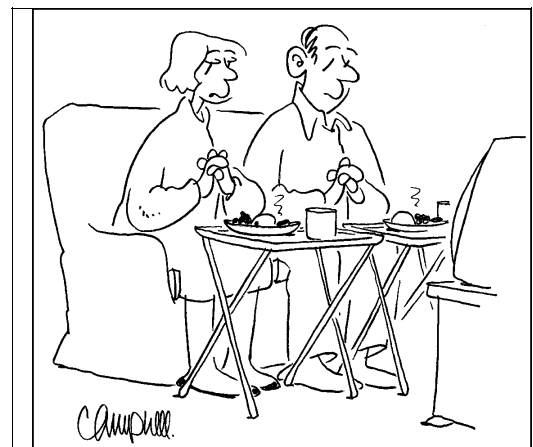

Student of the Month

Rachael Obermeyer

“Seventh graders today have very busy lives. Rachael Obermeyer is a seventh grade student at FCMS. Rachael is a volunteer at the local soup kitchen to feed the homeless. The soup kitchen, St. Clare’s Kitchen, is located at 2nd Avenue and

Broadway in Denver, Colorado. Her mom, Cynthia, is the chairperson for the mission and outreach at St. Martin-in-the-Fields Episcopal Church. Rachael and her mom also help with the local food banks, such as Operation Love.

Rachael started working at the soup kitchen when she was five. At the time her mom had wanted her to work there, but now she does it because she wants to. Every Tuesday the soup kitchen feeds 50 to 190 homeless people. Every fourth Tuesday, Rachael’s church is assigned to feed the homeless. When Rachael feeds the homeless it makes her feel happy because she knows that she helped people in their time of need. “Before we feed the homess, a service is held for healing and worship,” explains Rachael. Sometimes Rachael and the other volunteers have to domultiple jobs at the soup kitchen. We are lucky to have such an awesome seventh grader at FCMS!”

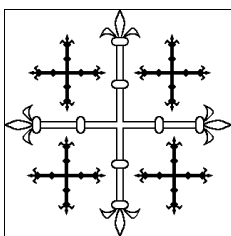
